I've always admired her beauty of features and character, her compassion for others, her achievements in laying piano, in art, dancing, tennis, ice skating, etc. Her good example has been a positive influence during my entire 62 years.

Dorothy and Ellsworth have always shown love and concern for the Hyrum Smith family. Their home has always been open to us and many other relatives who needed lodging. Lois and I each enjoyed spending a school year with them in Idaho
