Cherie-

Wie Hefindet Sie sich morgens? I hope fine. I feel that way myself as I went to bed about 10 o'clock and in about 15 minutes [...] came Lewis and then we both slept until 9 oclock this morning. He can't decide whether to buy a new car or some more sheep. He has about four hundred dollars to spend. Wish I had it. Wouldn't have any trouble finding a place to spend it. If we had

that much we could certainly do things- eh what?

Might go to Montepilier today as Lewis is playing ball there and probably [...] will be taking his car and going.

I'm wondering how I can get this letter in the mail today so that you'll get it Monday. No mail from Georgetown you see. Its about a mile and three quarters from here to the Georgetown R.R. Station if the passenger train stops I can mail it there. I think I'll try it. Have to hurry as [...] is a 1:30 train.
